

Information about personal data processing in connection with the obligatory pharmacotherapy safety monitoring by Vet-Agro Sp. z o.o.

The safety of our products is continuously monitored. The obligation to supervise the safety of pharmacotherapy results from laws in force, i.e. the act of 6 September 2001 *Pharmaceutical law* (Dz.U. 2001 of 126, 1381 as subsequently amended).

Any information about our product that we receive from you is analysed carefully. Because of that, if an adverse reaction or a query regarding a product is reported it will be necessary to guarantee the possibility to contact you to obtain further information and, in the case of queries, to make it possible to respond.

The purpose of this information is to describe the way in which your personal data are processed in connection with the obligatory supervision of the safety of pharmacotherapy.

According to art. 13 clause 1 of the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council (EU) 2016/679 of 27 April 2016 *on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data* and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation or GDPR), we would like to inform you that the Administrator of your personal data is Przedsiębiorstwo Wielobranżowe Vet-Agro Sp. z o.o. in Lublin with the registered office in ul. Gliniana 32.

Data you have submitted will only be processed in order to:

1. comply with the obligation to monitor the safety of veterinary medicinal products resulting from legal regulations: the act of 6 September 2001 *Pharmaceutical law* (Dz.U. 2001, 126,1381 as subsequently amended),
2. guarantee the possibility to contact you as a reporting person to obtain further information necessary to comply with the obligation mentioned in clause 1.

Your personal data will only be processed as necessary to carry out the activities resulting from the obligation to monitor the safety of pharmacotherapy.

Such data will be stored for the period necessary to attain the purpose for which they were collected.

If an adverse reaction is reported state the full name of the reporting person and, in the case of medical practitioners, the address where that profession is practiced (according to the form published under the "Contact" tab on our website). The obligation to submit such data results from laws in force: the act of 6 September 2001 *Pharmaceutical law* (Dz.U. 2001, 126, 1381 as subsequently amended) and the Regulation of the Minister of Health of 3 June 2014 *on the method and mode of supervision of the safe application of veterinary medicinal products* (Dz. U 2014, item 806). The submission of additional data such as the address, telephone number or e-mail address is voluntary; however, such data are necessary to carry out the activities related to the monitoring of the safety of pharmacotherapy, among other things, they make it possible to establish the contact to obtain the additional information about the reported adverse reaction.

Your personal data can be forwarded to competent regulatory authorities: national (the Office for Registration of Medicinal Products, Medical Devices and Biocidal Products) and European ones that are authorized to receive such information pursuant to laws in force.

The processing of personal data will take place with the use of appropriate technical and organizational measures ensuring compliance with legal requirements (GDPR, the act of 10 May 2018 *on data security* Dz. U 2018, item 1000).

We would like to inform you that you have the right to access the contents of your data, correct them and, within the limits resulting from the regulations, to delete them or limit their processing as well as to object to their processing. You also have the right to complain in connection with the incorrect processing of the above-mentioned data to the competent data security agency.

Your personal data will not be subjected to the automated decision-making process or profiling.
